- Social media – Social media is being used to connect with members and potential members with tips, invites, reminders and pictures from events.
 - Facebook Member Group has 538 members. In the past 9 months, 397 posts have been published.
 - Facebook Page – This page is focused on potential members and has 1600 followers.
 - LinkedIn – 384 followers are on LinkedIn. A second account has 137 followers.

 - District 86 has 114 subscribers and 57 videos have been published.
 - This year our YouTube Coordinator and YouTube team have recorded interviews of the District leaders to explain their roles and responsibilities.

- District 86 Performance (dashboard):
 - District 86 performance posted on April 1, 2024 showed 119 clubs and just over 4,000 membership payments.
 - District performance posted on April 14, 2024 showed Clubs to date dropped to 104. but Membership payments at 4,279, and 30 clubs are distinguished or better.
- District Performance in Region 6.

- District 86: #2 in Region 6 for new member payments, #2 in region for renewals. Every District in Region saw contraction, Our membership numbers shrank - 2.84% but District 86 contracted the least because club retention is so high.
- #2 in Region for Number of Clubs and 24% of our clubs are Distinguished or better, which is #1 in Region 6.
- Districts 60, 86 & 123 have similar statistics.
- What does that mean? The members here today are working hard. D86 could be healthier, but we are one of the strongest Districts in the region.
- Current Round Summary Area Director Visit Reports.
 - By visiting clubs, Area Directors identify strengths and opportunities for their clubs, while working to build and maintain positive relationships with each club.
 - When Area Director visits clubs or holds Area Council meetings, some items for discussion include:
 - Club Success Plan: 70 days left. What is still required at your club and who are the members that can help?
 - Are there other actions that still need to be completed? Weigh how each action contributes towards your club's key performance indicator – the Distinguished Club Program
 - Discuss Club status on the dashboard and if any leveling-up strategies are needed.
 - If you need a facilitator to run a specific workshop for Club members or officers, inform the Area director so they can help with outreach.
 - Milestones and succession.
- Club Elections held the first meeting in May
 - Every club needs leaders who can work with others to move the club forward.
 - Electing club officers is a critical part of a club's success; each officer can be actively reaching out to individual members with leadership potential and encourage them towards their leadership goals.
 - Club Elections are held at the first meeting in May.
 - Don't delay your club election if you don't have a full slate ready, because holding elections at any other time is in direct conflict with the Club Constitution for Clubs of Toastmasters International and Bylaws of Toastmasters International.
 - Run your election and if additional roles need to be filled, hold a by-election.
 - Once the new officers are elected, it is the current secretary or president, not the president-elect, or the secretary -elect, that submits the new names and contact information to World Headquarters through Club Central.
 - Do this immediately after the election. Never, leave it for the incoming officers to do this in July because 1) new leaders will not have access to club central, and 2) you will rob your members of an easy DCP admin goal for the new year.
